Year 6 Trip



Year 6 had an enlightening day starting with a workshop at Victoria Hall. Here, they were transported back in time to the Victorian era, learning about the lives of Saltaire's past residents and the rules they lived by. The highlight was a deep dive into the history of a real character from Saltaire.

In the afternoon, the students explored Saltaire's UNESCO World Heritage Site. They marvelled at the architectural wonders conceived by Titus Salt and engaged in a character-spotting scavenger hunt, bringing history to life in a tangible and memorable way. This hands-on experience provided Year 6 with a personal connection to the past, fostering a deeper appreciation for history and its impact on the present.

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Parking

A friendly reminder of the paramount importance of parking safety during school pick-up and drop-off times. Your vigilance and consideration are vital to ensuring the safety of our students and maintaining a secure school environment. Please observe the following guidelines:

1. Designated Zones: Use designated drop-off and pick-up zones whenever possible. Avoid stopping in non-designated areas to prevent congestion and potential hazards.
2. Speed Limits: Adhere to posted speed limits within the school zone. Drive cautiously, especially in areas with heavy pedestrian traffic.
3. Pedestrian Crossings: Exercise extra caution at pedestrian crossings. Always yield the right of way to pedestrians, and do not block crosswalks.
4. No Double Parking: Refrain from double parking, as it obstructs visibility and disrupts the safe flow of traffic.
5. Consider Others: Be considerate of our neighbors when parking near the school. Avoid blocking driveways and be mindful of residents.

School entrances

If you travel to school by car, do not stop (even to drop off or pick up) on "School - Keep - Clear" markings. Park well clear of the school entrance. A stationary car can prevent a driver seeing a child crossing the road. Don't be pressured by bad weather into parking too close to the school - better a wet coat than a visit to the A&E!

Do not park on pavements

Inconsiderate drivers who park their vehicles wholly or partially on the pavement not only cause danger - but also commit an offence of obstruction. They cause danger to pedestrians, especially children and parents with prams and pushchairs. Pavements are not constructed to take the weight of vehicles. The local authority may make a claim against you for the damage caused to the footpath.

Do not obstruct

You only visit the school twice a day, so why ruin the quality of life of residents? Parking across or near driveways obstructs the views of those trying to manoeuvre in and out of them. It is also anti-social behaviour.

The zig-zags are there for a purpose: To provide a clear area in which children can cross more safely

Please remember

- Don't let very young children out on their own.
- Make sure that they know roads are dangerous.
- Because of their size, children cannot see if the road is clear from behind parked cars.
- Drivers cannot see small children hidden by parked cars.
- When children go to and from school, there is usually a lot of traffic.

Can you park on Yellow zig zag lines outside a school?

Yellow zig zag lines and School Keep Clear markings outside schools that have signs listing the hours of operation will be enforced by the local council; this will include use of camera cars, CCTV or parking wardens to issue a penalty charge notice. The hours stated on signs usually relate to drop off and pick up times. You cannot drop off, pick up, wait or stop on zig zag lines and School Keep Clear markings during the hours of operation.

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Bonfire Safety



As we approach the Bonfire season, I want to take a moment to discuss an important matter that concerns the safety and well-being of your children. Fireworks, although thrilling, can pose serious risks when handled irresponsibly or without proper supervision. It is crucial for you, as parents and guardians, to ensure your children's safety and prevent them from misusing fireworks.

The use of fireworks is regulated by various laws and regulations to minimise the risks associated with them. The primary legislation governing fireworks is the Fireworks Regulations Act 2004, which restricts the sale, possession, and use of fireworks, especially among individuals under the age of 18. It is essential that you familiarise yourselves with these laws and regulations to uphold your responsibilities as parents and guardians. Here are some key points to consider:

1. **Age Restrictions:** Under UK law, it is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to possess category 2 and 3 fireworks in public places. Retailers are also prohibited from selling category 2 and 3 fireworks to individuals under this age limit.
2. **Responsible Supervision:** If your child is under 18 and wishes to enjoy fireworks, please ensure that they are always under the supervision of a responsible adult. Fireworks should never be left in the hands of children or teenagers.
3. **Noise and Nuisance:** Fireworks should not be used in a manner that causes distress to others or constitutes a nuisance. Misuse can lead to noise complaints and potential legal consequences.
4. **Legal Consequences:** The police take firework-related offences seriously. Robust action will be taken against anyone found committing offences such as underage possession, antisocial behaviour, or misuse of fireworks.

This Bonfire season let's work together to ensure children enjoy fireworks safely and responsibly. By doing so, we can help prevent accidents, protect our communities from unnecessary disturbances, and avoid any legal repercussions.

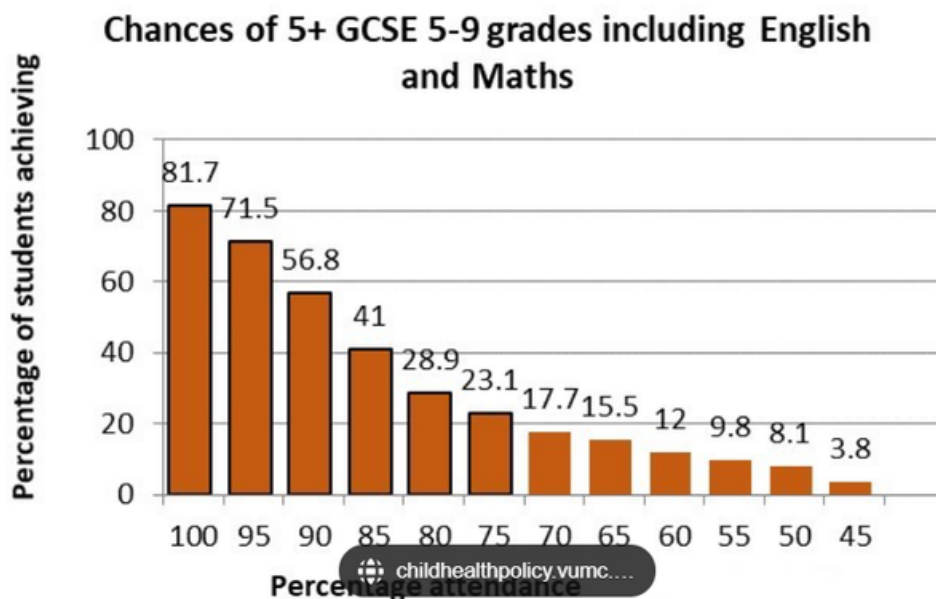


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Attendance
