Dental nurses support dentists with all areas of dental care.


Salaries for dental nurses range from £23 000 to £35 000.

There are many routes available to become a dental nurse including Level 3 Diploma courses at College, a T Level in Health or an Apprenticeship. You normally need 5 or more GCSEs at Grade 4 or above to get access to these courses.









SEND FOCUS

Each week we would like to introduce you to a particular area of SEND, this week we would like to focus on communication and interaction.

This area is linked to children and young people with speech, language and communication needs (SLCN) and those who have difficulty in communicating with others.

This may be because they:

- have difficulty saying what they want to
- don't understand what is being said to them
- don't understand or use social rules of communication

Every child with communication and interaction needs is different and their needs may change over time. They may have difficulty with one, some or all of the different aspects of speech, language or social communication at different times of their lives. Children and young people with autism spectrum conditions (ASC), Autism, are likely to have particular difficulties with social interaction. They may also experience difficulties with language, communication and imagination, which can impact on how they relate to others. Young people with this difficulty may 'mask' how hard they find interacting with others and so people may not realise that they struggle with this, as a result it could cause 'meltdowns' when they cannot manage the situation.

Autism is something that a person is born with and there is not a cure.
